NARRATIVE

On 2/14/09 at approximately 2057 hours, Officer Mark Abercrombie and I were dispatched to [redacted] Drive. Dispatch advised that a friend of [redacted] had contacted the police and advised that [redacted] was inside her residence with an individual who had been recently released from jail and they were in a physical altercation. Officer Abercrombie and I arrived at the residence. I walked up to the front door, and Officer Abercrombie walked around back and stated there were fresh mud prints leading to the back yard.

I walked up to the front door and rang the doorbell. The porch light came on and I could hear a scuffle behind the door. It sounded like somebody was trying to open the door and somebody was not allowing it. I advised them to open the door. I could hear a female from behind the door screaming "Let them in!" at which time I used force to open the door. When I kicked the door open, the individual standing behind the door slammed the door shut and was leaning up against it. Every time I added pressure to kick the door open, the individual behind the door was pushing it closed. We requested assistance and advised that individuals were attempting to barricade the door and not allow entry into the residence.

Officer Deidra Harr and Officer Guy McKean arrived on scene. Once I kicked the door, Officer McKean was able to keep the door open and we forced the door open and confronted Gerald Amidor behind the door, pushing him back into the hallway and advising him to get on the ground. We struggled with Amidor in an attempt to get his arms behind his back at which time Officer McKean advised he was drive stunning Amidor with the taser. Amidor then complied and he was handcuffed, double locked and checked for tightness. He stated he did not know it was the police who was knocking at the door although it appeared he looked through the peephole when we arrived and due to the close proximity of the porch, I was standing directly in front of the door when I rang the doorbell in full uniform.

He was taken outside and placed in a patrol car and checked over by EMS. Due to the fact that the darts did not deploy on Gerald, EMS cleared him for transport.

Officer Mark Abercrombie went inside the residence and spoke to victim [redacted]. She wrote in a written statement that Gerald Amidor contacted her around 5:45 p.m. and requested a ride to his residence from a friend's house. She stated no, she would not give him a ride, she was going to spend some quality time with her son and took her child to Planet Kid at approximately 2030 hours. She stated when she arrived at her residence, she observed that the porch light was on and the dining room light was on. She then saw Gerald Amidor's figure through the dining room window. She stated that he shut off both lights. She stated that, at that time, she called her friend, [redacted] and asked her to bring over one of her "big guy friends." She stated that she stayed on the phone with [redacted] for a while while she looked in the door. [redacted] stated she saw garbage strewn up and down the hallway and her room was completely ransacked. She stated that she left to take [redacted] to the babysitter but had to return to the house to find her phone charger. She stated that while she was searching her ransacked room for the charger, she heard a knock at the front door. At first she didn't answer it for fear it was Gerald and it was. She stated that he let out a string of convincing apologies and begged her to let him into the residence so they could talk. She stated they had dated a few times over the past few months but they were not seriously involved.

She stated that she let him in after about five minutes of hearing his begging and apologies and she told him she wanted him out of her life. She stated she has a three year old and does not want drama in any relationship. She stated they proceeded to argue back and forth and she told him numerous times to leave the house and he refused. She stated that her friends pulled up outside and went to the door at which time he stepped in front of it and would not let her out. He said he wanted her to call her friends and tell them to leave before he would leave. She advised him that the phone was dead and to let her out the door to tell them to

leave in person. She stated he physically held the door shut and told her that her cell phone wasn't dead and forcibly tried to remove it from her hands. She stated the doorbell rang and someone tried entering. Gerald held the door shut as they tried five or six times to kick it in. Finally, three Police Officers kicked in the door and tackled Gerald to the floor.

Gerald was transported to Ada County Jail and booked. While there, Sgt. Stevens arrived and advised that we were going to interview Gerald about what had occurred tonight. Gerald was placed in a cell with table and chairs and we went in. I advised Gerald of his Miranda Rights and he agreed to talk about what had occurred tonight.

Gerald's version of events was that he had, in fact, contacted her for a ride and she had not returned his phone call. He walked over to the residence and once inside the residence, she arrived home and they argued in the house. When asked about the ransacked bedroom, he stated that he and her had both thrown items around inside her bedroom. He stated that they had worked out their problems and she had contacted her friend to bring over another friend to "kick his ass" and he thought that was who was knocking at the door instead of the Police Department. He stated he was getting ready to leave and was willing to leave when someone was attempting to kick in the door and he was in fear that it was [REDACTED] friends and that is why he was holding the door shut.

After about twenty minutes of Gerald's talking, I advised him how my case was going to go. I advised him that [REDACTED] stated he was not welcome in the residence and he had entered the residence unlawfully and stated he had left when she went into the house and that he had come back. I advised him that when I was attempting to kick the door open, I observed him push [REDACTED] back away from the door as he slammed the door shut and that he had committed battery in my presence on [REDACTED]. I advised him that because he was attempting to keep us out of the residence and would not allow her to let us into the residence, he was holding her against her will and she was not free to leave, and I advised him that that was false imprisonment and he could be charged with kidnapping as well.

Amidor then stated he would like to tell the truth as to what really happened. He stated that she would not give him a ride and he, in fact, came back over to the residence. When he entered the residence, he observed roses on the table in the living room and became upset. He stated he did ransack the bedroom and then left and contacted [REDACTED] by phone. He stated that he came back over to the residence where they continued to argue about what had occurred tonight. He stated he did hear the doorbell ring and walked over and turned on the porch light at which time he stated that someone was attempting to kick in the door. I advised him that I could hear the scuffle behind the door and that her yelling to "Let them in!" and I advised that that was the time that I started to attempt to break down the door to get inside the residence. I advised him I was charging him with false imprisonment, unlawful entry, and battery.

He was turned over to the on duty jailers for booking.

Our entire conversation was recorded on my tape recorder as well as Sgt. Stevens' tape recorder.

Photographs of the residence were taken by Officer Hilton and placed into evidence.

Amidor was issued citation #1328696 for unlawful entry and battery and citation #1328697 for false imprisonment.
